

Welcome to the May/June 2021 Bulletin for the Peninsula Section of National Council of Jewish Women. This has been a most momentous year. The pandemic slowed us down at first. We were asked to isolate ourselves, not to have physical contact, but we are Jewish women who must communicate with each other and remain involved in the world. So we looked for different ways of reaching out to you. We transitioned to providing almost everything we do in email, print and on Zoom. We meet in Zoom format, and have virtual programs and lectures. (My husband calls me "Queen of the Zoom!") The good part of this is that you can join us from anywhere – our reach has been extended around the country and beyond, and we love your increased attendance!

Just some of the activities we have shared – our health forum featuring a comedienne (as laughter IS the best medicine), programs on happiness, where we go from here politically, the ties that bind Black and Jewish communities. We have been entertained by a cantorial concert, and discussed novels and nonfiction books. Our Zoom crafts



included making mask holders and pretzels, and our other workshops helped us to relieve stress and grow older and wiser. Lectures ran the gamut from Hollywood movies to the court system. We toured the Glen Cove Holocaust Memorial and Tolerance Center virtually, and viewed the film "The Barn" so that we may never forget.

Our advocacy work had us signing up and encouraging people to vote in the most important Presidential election of my life. We had a food drive to aid those who suffered food insecurities. We mourned the loss of Supreme Court Justice Ruth Bader Ginsburg with a ritual walk around the Lawrence Courthouse. We wrote letters and signed petitions supporting causes that NCJW.org, our parent organization, suggested, joining with our NCJW sisters from across the nation to increase our impact. We saw the film "What Doesn't Kill Us" to learn about injustices against divorcing women in the court system.

NCJW Peninsula Section's provision of in-person Community Services have slowed down a bit temporarily, but we are still supporting CALE and the Five Towns Early Learning Center and celebrating graduating young women's community service with recognition. Our Back to School Store has continued to provide needy children with clothing and school supplies, sending the items directly to the agencies and schools to distribute them. We all miss serving in the pop-up store, and hope to resume it in the future.

Our Thrift Shop reopened during the pandemic with extra precautions in place to protect all who enter the store. Thank you, Marci Last and Lori Grossman, for your managerial skills and attention to the health and safety of staff, volunteers and customers. We welcome our newest thrift shop employee, Assistant Manager, Victoria Viteri. Please support the Thrift Shop by donating and shopping there. It is a most valuable piece of who we are.

Jewish Life Program, "THE BARN"

On March 16th close to 100 people who registered for NCJW Peninsula Section's Jewish Life Program, "THE BARN", had the honor and privilege to meet the grandchild of Holocaust Survivors, Actress and Film Producer, Rachel Kastner. Rachel "zoomed" in from Israel and told of her path to becoming a documentary film producer, introduced her film, and answered questions after the viewing.

The audience was captivated to learn of Rachel's grandfather's story of survival during the Holocaust, when he was hidden, as a child, in a bunker, dug out under a farmer's barn for 18 months. Attendees felt that they were on this journey of memory and rediscovery along with Rachel and her grandfather, Karl Schapiro.

The reactions to the film elicited strong emotions from the audience. I received comments such as:



"Throughout the film tears just slid down my face. Their story was one of love, family and the power to survive."

"Personally, I was overwhelmed with emotion. It was a powerful and riveting presentation."

"A story of a grandfather and granddaughter who brought us a story of terrible proportions in such a heartwarming way."

"So glad that I was able to watch this important and beyond heartwrenching documentary made by such a promising young filmmaker."

Once again, I want to thank everyone who joined us for this event and especially thank Rachel Kastner for sharing her film that premiered in 2019 at the International Miami Jewish Film Festival and has since been shown in classrooms and with audiences around the world.

NCJW Peninsula Section is committed to 'continue the conversation' and will be having future programs so we can fulfill our obligations to tell Holocaust stories to future generations to be certain that WE MUST NEVER FORGET!
