

Still Helping Families in Need

HOPE COLEMAN - Back 2 School Store, VP

Although the pandemic has not allowed us to hold the Back 2 School Store (B2SS) as we know it, we have not been idle. There are still great needs in the community that we have been working to address. Instead of holding merchandise until a traditional Back 2 School Store can safely take place, we have been finding ways to help children.

This past summer, we formed a partnership with Island Harvest Food Bank to safely and efficiently distribute our clothing and supplies. Due to this collaboration, were able to reach children in a large number of local communities including Lawrence, Inwood, Elmont, Freeport, Long Beach, Hempstead, Roosevelt, Uniondale and Westbury.

One of our agency contacts in Hempstead asked if we could supply sneakers for the children. Their old shoes were very worn, and not at all appropriate for winter wear. We were able to purchase and donate 250 pairs of sneakers, to the delight of the Hempstead community.

Every year we receive a sizeable donation of Bombas socks. This past year we had them shipped directly to Freeport Schools where they were distributed.

We have recently given additional items to the Kids Closet in the Hewlett-Woodmere school district. The JCC served an additional 50 families. And, the Roosevelt Library had a special distribution with one of their community events.

We'd like to share one experience with you. Shortly before Thanksgiving, our contact in Hempstead called to invite us to their clothing give-away. We arrived to find a community room, meticulously organized, stocked entirely with clothing provided

We will not be doing our traditional Back 2 School Store this year due to COVID concerns. However, we are proud to report that plans are underway to again partner with Island Harvest in August to give clothing to children in our community. Island Harvest has been so appreciative that we choose to partner with them. It is a win-win for all.

From Allan Elias of Ben Elias Industries, Corp who provided the majority of our children's clothing since our inception. Unfortunately, they will no longer be carrying children's clothing. We thanked Allan for all of their support in the past and for helping us provide clothing to approximately 7,500 children. Here is his response:

Though gun violence is pervasive in the United States, there are steps you can take locally to keep you and your family safe. Did you know that over 13 million households with children contain at least one gun? Maybe yours is one of those households or maybe your child or grandchild visits one of those households. Either way, safe storage is an adult's responsibility.

Join NCJW Peninsula Section in partnership with Moms Demand Action for Gun Sense in America for an interactive presentation to learn about BE SMART – the five action steps that can keep you and your family safe. A survivor will share her story of how senseless gun violence is impacting her life. This practical and informative program is for parents, grandparents and all adults concerned about kids, guns and safety.

Students who attend with a parent or guardian will earn Community Service hours.

NCJW Hails Senate Bill to Reauthorize Violence Against Women Act

Thanks to our NCJW movement and persistent coalition mobilization and actions, the Senate introduced the long awaited Violence Against Women Reauthorization Act of 2022. The original law signed in 1994, which NCIW helped to write, must get reauthorized every five years to ensure continued funding for lifesaving services that assist survivors of domestic violence, dating violence, sexual assault, and stalking. The Senate bill, which again NCJW helped to write, includes many historic victories that will prevent violence and increase access to services, safety, and justice!

Below you will see a segment of a statement made by our National CEO, Sheila Katz, on February 9, 2022 in Washington, D.C.

After considered deliberations, the Senate introduced a bipartisan bill to help end the scourge of domestic violence, sexual assault, dating violence, and stalking. Women, children, and families across the country will feel the positive effects of critical updates to the Violence Against Women Act (VAWA) thanks to Sens. Dick Durbin (D-IL), Joni Ernst (R-IA), Dianne Feinstein (D-CA), and Lisa Murkowski (R-AK).

Each time VAWA has been reauthorized, it has been strengthened based on our increased understanding of gender-based violence. The Violence Against Women Reauthorization Act of 2022 is no different. Informed by survivors and advocates, the bill would invest in prevention; increase access to services for survivors, including community-specific services and legal services; maintain existing protections for all survivors, including immigrant, LGBTQ, and Native survivors; improve housing access for survivors; expand access to safety and justice for Native survivors; sustain vital non-discrimination provisions; improve access for culturally specific communities; and address the needs of incarcerated women. It is an important step in the right direction for survivors.

Advancing Solutions for Extraordinary Risks -**Address From Nobel Peace Laureate**

PAM SHELDEN - Chair, Advocacy Film Series

At NCJW Peninsula Section's January 18th program meeting, we were joined by Seth Shelden, the United Nations Liaison for the International Campaign to Abolish Nuclear Weapons (ICAN), winner of the 2017 Nobel Peace Prize. (Among other things, Seth is also – full disclosure – my son.)

Seth addressed the NCJW membership about heightened risks posed by nuclear weapons today, the media's failure to contextualize these risks appropriately, and ICAN's work to advance a solution in the form of the UN Treaty on the Prohibition of Nuclear Weapons (TPNW). The TPNW, which entered into force a year ago, is the first global treaty to prohibit nuclear weapons comprehensively.

We discussed also how our membership can contribute to the total elimination of nuclear weapons, including by reaching out to federal representatives (e.g., using ICAN's legislative pledge) and local rep-

resentatives (e.g., using the ICAN Cities Appeal, just adopted by New York City in December), divesting our finances and our alma maters from the nuclear weapons industry, and, if we wish, becoming an ICAN partner organization.


