NCJW Peninsula Section is joining **Stand Up To Jewish Hate**, a new campaign to educate all Americans about the rise of antisemitism and mobilize people outside the Jewish community to help us address growing hate and intolerance.

We are asking everyone to post and share # on social media, using the blue square emoji on your phone, as a simple but powerful unifying symbol of solidarity.

We all know that antisemitism is rising at alarming rates in the United States.




Yet, new polling finds that more than half of Americans do not believe "antisemitism is a big problem" and nearly half believe that "Jews are more than capable of handling issues of antisemitism on their own".

That's why NCJW Peninsula Section is proud to be a Campaign Partner of the Foundation to Combat Antisemitism and a wide coalition of Jewish and non-Jewish groups, to raise awareness and empower all Americans to join us to prevent hatred and intolerance towards Jews. We need to drive home the message that while Jews make up just 2.4% of the U.S. population, we are the victims of 55% of all religious hate crimes.

Reproductive Rights Shabbat

MYRA GARBER - VP, Membership

Friday, February 17, 2023 and Saturday, February 18, 2023 were declared Reproductive Rights Shabbat by the National Council of Jewish Women. Many Rabbis across the country support abortion and reproductive freedom as a Jewish value, and they agreed to discuss this with their congregations that weekend.

Temple Am-Ehad in Lynbrook held Shabbat services to present the topic. The Temple was kind enough to invite NCJW members from our section to participate. Rabbi Dennis Ross spoke of the history of women's struggle to control their bodies. He talked about Margaret Sanger, who first began reproductive choice for women over 100 years ago, opening her first clinic in New York. Sanger founded the American Birth Control League, which became the Planned Parenthood Federation. NCJW has often partnered with Planned Parenthood.

Gina Baldwin of Planned Parenthood and the National Institute of Reproductive Health, spoke about legislation that may affect reproductive rights in the U.S., including the overturning of Roe v. Wade and the attack on medication abortions.

We thank Temple Am-Ehad's Social Action committee for developing this program and offering it to NCJW.
