Honorary Peninsula Board Enduring Leaders



Through the decades Peninsula Section has been blessed with outstanding leadership. The strength of the section has depended on their dedication, service and varied skills. Until most recently, these women had not been formally recognized, but that changed with the creation of a new designation (that of) "Honorary Peninsula Board Enduring Leader." Criteria were established and a list of eligible women was created. There were dozens of distinguished candidates who had served as an officer and on the board for at least 18 years. After much discussion and deliberation there were seven outstanding women selected to fill this first group of recipients. They are as follows: Sandra Mintz, Gloria Okin, Helen Pollack, Marcia Roth, Harriet Rubenstein, Florence Steiger, and Babs Yaspan.

As part of the Installation of the 2023-24 Board of Directors, each honoree received an exquisite crystal heart inscribed as follows "NCJW, Peninsula Section, Honorary Enduring Board Member, [name of Honoree], 2023"

SANDRA MINTZ. Sandra's leadership, devotion and decades of commitment are now recognized. She has been Executive Vice President, Vice President of Community Services, Membership and Marketing, and Fund Raising and Corresponding Secretary. However, her greatest impact has been with Advocacy and the Promote the Vote Campaign. She made a difference in Albany and Washington. Sandra surely is an Enduring Leader.

GLORIA OKIN. Gloria has been an NCJW member for almost 40 years. She has been a Vice President of Public Relations and Public Affairs, Membership and Marketing, and the Thrift Shop. Gloria was co-editor of The Bulletin and Chair of the PENT program. She attended many National meetings. In 2006 she received the prestigious Hannah G. Solomon Award. NCJW and the women she has worked with have enriched Gloria's life.

HELEN POLLACK. Helen began her Peninsula Section journey when she and her husband Irving retired and were looking for something meaningful to do. Helen's bio includes a myriad of important positions. This includes eight years as the Thrift Shop Vice President and leading our Campership Program. She organized overnight trips, as well as establishing the Group Discussions at the Health Related Facility. Helen even started the Jewish Film Series at the Peninsula Library. She attended many conventions in Albany and Washington and even went on an Israel Mission with NCJW. As you can see, Helen is certainly an Enduring Leader.

MARCIA ROTH. Marcia has earned her place as a distinguished and valued member of NCJW, Peninsula Section. She has been Vice President of Community Services, Fundraising, and Membership as well as Recording Secretary. Marcia ran the English as a Second Language Program in District 14, and made a difference in the lives of so many children. She also ran senior programs in three community centers. As a leader through the years she helped increase our membership and brought in much needed funds.

HARRIET RUBENSTEIN. When Harriet moved to Cedarhurst she read in the local paper about a new member event, she attended, and the rest is history. She began her volunteering career in the Thrift Shop, and took on many positions in all aspects of the Section. She has been Thrift Shop Treasurer, Recording Secretary, Executive Vice President, Vice President of Public Relations, and Vice President of Community Services. Her special memories include National Conventions in Miami, Dallas, Los Angeles, and Washington Institute where she met Hillary Clinton when she was New York's State Senator. Harriet's personal highlight was being selected as a Hannah G. Solomon recipient.

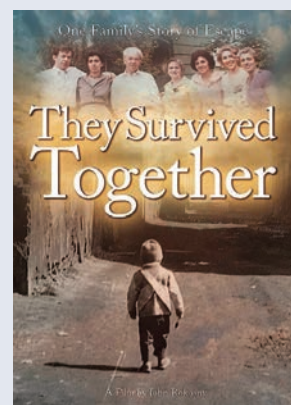
They Survived Together

From the ashes of the Holocaust, we find hope in the Niger family story. 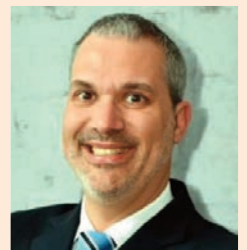

Etzion Neuer is Senior Deputy Regional Director & Director of Community Engagement for ADL's New York/New Jersey Office. He oversees the region's community engagement, incident response, policy/advocacy, law enforcement partnerships, and relationship building. In his capacity Etzion has oversight over the region's incident response system – a network of trained staff who respond and resolve reports of antisemitism, discrimination, and civil rights issues. Etzion joined ADL in 1999, and over his career has served in multiple roles at the regional and national level. Etzion was previously a Hillel Director in Montreal, Canada, where he was born.

Rabbi Michel Schlesinger comes to Hewlett-East Rockaway Jewish Centre, Congregation Etz Chaim, from the Congregacao Israelita Paulista in São Paulo, Brazil, the largest synagogue in Latin America, where he was Senior Rabbi from March 2007 to 2021. He had been Assistant Rabbi at the CIP since August, 2005. He has a Bachelor of Laws from the University of Sao Paulo, and his rabbinical ordination and a Masters in Talmudic Studies and Halacha from the Schechter Institute of Jewish Studies in Jerusalem. He took additional coursework at the Rabbinical Management Institute in Los Angeles, the Jewish Theological Seminary, and the Leo Baeck Institute in London. He has published a book, *Dialogues of A Rabbi*.

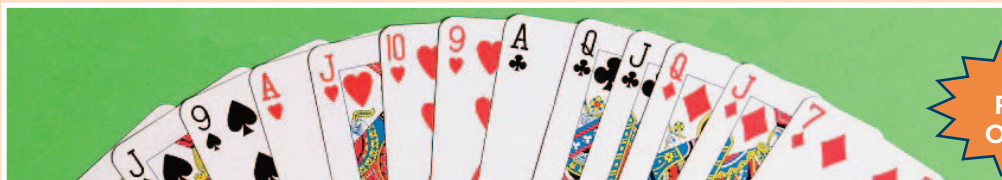
