NCJW Peninsula Section Attends ADL NEVER IS NOW Summit

The Anti-Defamation League held its Annual ADL NEVER IS NOW Summit, the world's largest summit on Antisemitism and Hate, on March 6th and March 7th, 2024, at the Jacob Javits Center in NYC. The huge rise in antisemitism was a theme that reverberated throughout the conference.

The summit was hosted by ABC News anchor Juju Chang and journalist and author Abigail Pogrebin. Speakers, including President Herzog of Israel; Deborah Lipstadt, Special Envoy to Monitor and Combat Antisemitism; Former Secretary of State Hillary Clinton; Attorney General Merrick Garland; and ADL CEO Jonathan Greenblatt, addressed the audience of 4,000.

National Council of Jewish Women CEO Sheila Katz played a pivotal role at the conference. She was part of a panel which discussed sexual violence as a weapon of war on October 7th. She spoke of her role in having a United Nations hearing on the issue and emphasized the importance of Jewish women's voices in policy making. In addition to her participation on the panel, she had the honor of introducing Attorney General Merrick Garland who movingly spoke of his family members lost in the Holocaust.

Some of the prestigious awards went to the following changemakers. Accenture CEO Julie Sweet was awarded ADL's Courage Against Hate Award and Nusier Yassin CEO of Nas Company was the recipient of the Daniel Pearl Award.

Over 100 experts and 25+ breakout sessions covered topics regarding college anti-semitism, hateful content on social media, sexual violence committed against women on 10/7, and challenging antisemitism in the workplace.

Local residents Pamela Korn and Pnina Knopf, board members of the National Council of Jewish Women Peninsula Section, attended the two-day summit. Ms. Korn said, "I attended this conference because of the frightening rise in hate towards Jews. I want to ensure that my grandsons will live in a world where they do not fear being Jewish." Ms. Knopf said, "It was the most well-organized, well-executed, impactful and empowering conference I have ever attended."

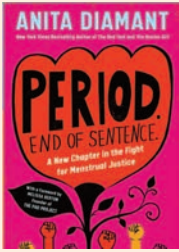

In keeping with our Jewish principle to welcome and care for the stranger, NCJW's Thrift Shop did just that. During the bitter cold days of winter our NCJW Thrift Shop employees jumped into action to help women, children and families in need. Carloads of surplus merchandise were loaded to be distributed at the shelter at Floyd Bennet Field. Within 30 minutes of arrival at least 50 Asylum Seekers and their families received blankets, hats, gloves, scarves, shoes and suitcases that they desperately needed, not to mention leggings, sweatshirts and socks to keep them warm. We thank our donor and personnel friend, Laura Glabman, who picked up and delivered the items. The recipients were most grateful not only for the items but for the generosity and care shown to them. Thank you to those who helped make this possible.

Miriam and Music – A Morning of Family Fun

On Sunday, April 7, 2024, NCJW Peninsula Section and Hewlett East-Rockaway Jewish Centre (HERJC) held a collaborative event call “Miriam and Music”. Fifty children from HERJC’s Religious School were accompanied by an adult for a morning of creativity, music, and fun along with members from NCJW. The children decoupage tambourines while the adults decoupage wine glasses (Miriam’s Cups), both to be used for their Passover Seders.

Miriam’s Cup helps highlight and signify that women played an important role in the exodus from Egypt. Legend tells of a mysterious well filled with “mayim chayim”, living waters, that followed the Israelites through their wandering in the desert while Miriam was alive. Miriam’s Well was said to hold Divine power to heal and renew. Its fresh waters sustained our people as we transformed from a generation shaped by slavery into a free nation.

To bring Miriam and women into the narrative, many families are now placing Miriam’s Cup on their Seder tables. Children shake and bang their tambourines as the many Passover songs are shared during the Seder. Everyone was encouraged to start their own family traditions with the beautiful art they created.

At the Sunday morning event a guitarist played holiday music while the ballroom was filled with excitement and song. The gathering of 100+ attendees was abuzz with creative energy that was channeled into their respective projects.

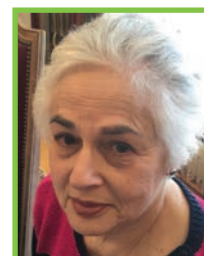


Hope Coleman **VICE PRESIDENT, BACK 2 SCHOOL STORE**

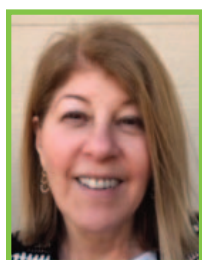

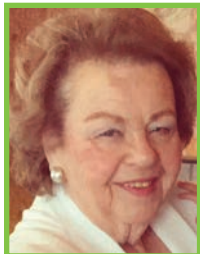


Myra Garber **VICE PRESIDENT, ADVOCACY**

Natalie Zeiger RECORDING SECRETARY



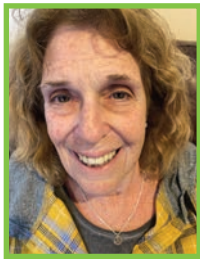

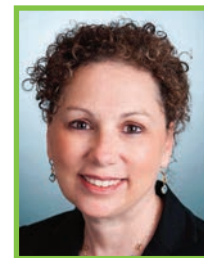


Myra Cohen MEMBERSHIP SECRETARY

Presents her New Historical Novel, "The Boy With the Star Tattoo"

This epic novel of love, loss and courage spans postwar France, from 1949, when Israeli agents roamed the countryside to rescue hidden Jewish orphans, to the 1969 daring escape of the Israeli boats of Cherbourg.
