Message from the President

The old adage "There's Strength in Numbers" might be on shaky ground these days when it often seems that whoever yells the loudest has the edge. But I believe when we act and advocate from the belief that **WE ARE STRONGER TOGETHER** we can overcome the noise and move our agenda forward. I hear a message that is fiercely positive, brave and active in this phrase. It's a statement that invites us to Unite, Stand Tall & Make a Difference.

Action comes in many forms. Sometimes the impact is immediate but often you have

I hear a message that is fiercely positive, brave and active in this phrase. It's a statement that invites us to Unite, Stand Tall & Make a Difference. to wait to see the results. Ten months ago, in April, 2024, 30 NCJW members from New York State headed to the State Capital in Albany for NCJW's Annual LOBBY DAY. Our mission was to hold "informational meetings" with State Legislators to encourage their support for proposed laws



around abortion medication, health information privacy and related topics. We left Albany not really knowing how persuasive we had been, but now the results are in and we can confirm **WE ARE STRONGER TOGETHER**: The Health Privacy Act, which we advocated for, passed and is on the Governor's desk for her signature. Additional legislators signed on as sponsors for the other bills we discussed and these bills are on the legislative agenda for this year. By working

together we were able to have greater impact and really get the conversation going.

Sometimes the results of working together are more immediate. In just the first two months of 2025 we have clearly demonstrated that **WE ARE STRONGER TOGETHER**.

- When the wild fires devastated the Los Angeles area. NCJW Sections around the country quickly responded by donating to the LA Section's emergency relief fund. WE ARE STRONGER TOGETHER.
- ◆ In January, we offered another free screening of the moving Holocaust documentary THE BARN to Middle and High School students and many others. We partnered with local school districts, synagogues, churches, JCCs, Holocaust Remembrance Centers and NCJW Sections around the country and were able to share this moving film with a wide audience. WE ARE STRONGER TOGETHER.

That is why it is so important to come off the sidelines and get involved. It could be something as small as signing an online petition or sending an automated message to your local, state or Congressional representatives. You can make a donation to a cause you believe in or make phone calls in support of a cause that's important to you. Let's acknowledge that neither you or I alone will be the solution, but **ALL OF US STANDING TOGETHER** could be just what we need.

The Equal Rights Amendment Has Been Declared the Law of the Land

On Friday, January 17, 2025, President Joe Biden declared the Equal Rights Amendment to be duly ratified as law in the United States. It is now the 28th Amendment to the Constitution. It guarantees all Americans equal rights and protections under the law, regardless of sex. Mr. Biden declared in one of his final moves as President that he believes that the Equal Rights Amendment has met the requirements of the amendment, as three-fourths of the states have ratified it and therefore it is now part of the Constitution.

New York Senator Kirsten Gillibrand was instrumental in this final push, gathering many in Congress and other supporters to urge the president to leave this as part of his legacy.


NCJW, both nationally and in Peninsula Section, has been working for this moment for a long time. We have marched, protested, and cheered for the rights we deserve.

This past autumn, President Donna Bialor, Executive Director Bonnie Sperry, and Advocacy and Education Vice President Myra Garber attended rallies with Carolyn Maloney, head of the New York State Equal Rights Amendment group, and met with U.S. Representative Anthony D'Esposito's staff to plead the case for this law.

NCJW Peninsula Section held a program meeting in October, 2024, featuring the Vice President of the National Organization of Women, Bear Atwood. She declared that we need the ERA NOW! Bear spoke about the slippage of women's rights all around the country, and how we need the local, state and national laws to protect us. And it worked! New York passed its law on Election Day. Thank you to all who voted for the NY Amendment! And now our rights will be enshrined in the Constitution of the land!

There may be challenges, as ratification has taken longer than expected. Many say those limits were arbitrary and can be declared null and void. We will see what occurs and remain vigilant.

As Hillary Clinton declared in 1995: "Let it be that human rights are women's rights and women's rights are human rights, once and for all!"





Advocacy Film Series

SHOAH: A Holocaust Documentary



◆ Sunday, April 27, 2:00 pm, Gold Hall, Hewlett-Woodmere Public Library

Often considered the most significant treatment of the Holocaust, the epic documentary (11 years in the making), "Shoah" (the Hebrew word for "annihilation") presents Holocaust events through Director Lanzmann's interviews with survivors, perpetrators, and bystanders at Chelmno (the first Nazi extermination camp), Treblinka, Auschwitz-Birkenau and the Warsaw Ghetto. With calm and dispassion, director Claude Lanzmann allows the harrowing interview testimony to reveal man's capacity for evil and hatred. Though we may have heard victims' stories many times, the screening gives us a more complete and many-sided picture of the events. For sure, we need to pay attention to Lanzmann's caution to be aware and alert lest this happen again.

Facilitator/Guest Speaker: Dr. Bernie Furshpan, Vice Chairman of the Board, Holocaust Memorial and Tolerance Center, Nassau County and child of Holocaust survivors, will lead the discussion, as well as the Q and A, following the screening.






