Celebrating the International Day of the Girl on October 11th has become an annual tradition for many. In particular, NCJW Peninsula Section has embraced the importance of this day. This year, our Generation Next teens (two males and two females) who have joined

the effort are Raven Kelly, Nicholas Gilleeny, Levi Goldin, and Helena Napoli. These young people wrote over 20 letters to their national, state, and local officials, asking them to proclaim/recognize October 11 as The International Day of the Girl. With permission from their school officials, they also entered classrooms and created posters,

educating their school peers about the day's importance. In 2024, in fact, Raven Kelly was given permission to address her entire school population during homeroom period. She was given speaker broadcast time to highlight girls' exploitation through such practices as forced child marriage, lack of access to education and technology, exposure to violence including genital mutilation and insufficient attention to health needs. After her presentation, Raven was applauded

by her fellow students who learned the importance of what she had shared. Awareness and understanding were always the teens' goals. In recognition of Sophia Gilleeny's 4-year effort and success in the initiative, Sophia, upon graduation, was awarded \$1,000 from a family foundation who understood the importance of celebrating the day. Peninsula Section is proud of our teens. Plan now to join them and to celebrate IDG on October 11th so as to make a difference!

## SIBSPlace, The Support, Warmth and Friendships Found Here Improves Lives

I'd like to give you a quick update on SIBSPlace. This year we will be celebrating our 25th anniversary. I say "we" rather than "they" because NCJW Peninsula Section has been on this journey with SIBS since the beginning. SIBSPlace was founded as a support program for children, ages 5–17 living with a family member who has a catastrophic or terminal illness. Led by skilled and caring mental health social workers, it strives to provide support and attention to the unique experiences and needs of well children facing issues related to the illness of a family member. A few years ago, to meet the overwhelming need, we added a program for children and families experiencing the loss of a loved one. Over the years we have worked with well over 1,000 children and family members. These are the important facts, but it's the kids and their stories that make SIBS the vital, life changing program that it is.

### Some of Our SIBS Kids Special Stories

The extent to which the kids bond in what we call "their other family" is amazing. Kathy, a SIBS kid who graduated six years ago, recently got married and her wedding party included three of her old SIBS friends. Other SIBS kids were guests and our director was also there. But Zach outdid that by being best man at the wedding of his old SIBS pal.

And while we're talking about weddings, after Jai Min's mother passed away her father went back to China to find a new wife, he mentioned to his Bereavement Group that he was going to come home from work, pick her up, and to go to the Justice of the Peace and "get it done." The other members of the group told him (in no uncertain terms!) that he should come home, shower, put on his best suit, have his wife-to-be and Jai Min put on their best dresses, and then they could go to the Justice of the Peace. Afterwards, the group thought he should take everybody out for a very special dinner. He did and the family celebrated and created a very special memory to cherish.

On a less jolly note (but equally a part of SIBSPlace), at the funeral of Danny's dad, where we adults might bring a cake or other sweets to our grieving friend, Kevin brought new Pokémon cards for his pal. Nothing could have been more appropriate!

To indicate how strong the sense of belonging is among our kids, when we brought our therapy dog, Daisy, to SIBS and she did her true and false trick, ringing the bell to say she was white, Carlos looked at her very faded areas of beige and said, "She's not really all white. Maybe she's Hispanic like me."

SIBSPlace is there for our kids and families in ways no other organization could be. We're an important part of their lives, one which supports and strengthens them while building lasting relationships and teaching both the kids and their families coping skills with which to live productive, fulfilling, and hopefully, joy filled lives.

But by the time they finish their shopping adventure, they are skipping and high-fiving, carrying a full shopping bag and a full backpack and there's usually a big hug at the end. It can really melt your heart!

Rosh Hashanah, the beginning of our New Year, is a perfect time to make new connections and strengthen existing ones. As we celebrate Rosh Hashanah we gather with family and friends.
